- The yearly assessment will be done on the basis of these evaluations, and also notebook, assignments and project work.
- Syllabus covered in first term shall not be included in the second term.

3. Any student indulging in any unfair means or missing any school exam, will not be eligible for any award.

Classes IV to VIII

The grading for Work Education, Art Education, Health and Physical Education, Discipline (Attendance, Sincerity, and Values) will be based on the four-point scale as mentioned for classes I to III.

Grading for Classes IV to VIII

The report card will indicate letter grade in each subject on eight-point scale as mentioned for class I to III.

The grades for General Awareness & Logical Reasoning, Third Language and Computer Education will also be awarded on an eight-point scale. With regard to promotion to the next Class. Those who secure qualifying grades (i.e. D and above), will be promoted to the next higher class.

Criteria for Promotion

1. Promotion is granted on the basis of cumulative performance of the pupil. Hence, it is important for a child to be regular in attendance, term examinations and assignments.
2. For promotion to the next class, the student must secure minimum D grade in all the main subjects and auxiliary subjects that is Computer Education, General Awareness and Logical Reasoning.
3. Attendance for all tests is compulsory. If a child doesn't appear in any test due to medical reasons, he/she has to submit a medical certificate with an application on the day he/she rejoins the school. No student will be allowed to leave after the tests during the school hours.
4. Students indulging in unfair means during any examination will be marked zero in the subject. Repetition of the same will result in expulsion. They will NOT be eligible for any academic award, school appointment or any prize by the school.
5. A child who fails twice in the same class will not be permitted to continue his/her studies in school.

Students have to secure 33 percent in total in each of these components.

School Based/Board Based Examination (80 Marks)

The board pattern will be followed for both the classes in the Annual Examinations. **It will cover entire syllabus of the year.** Any other changes may be incorporated as per CBSE Directives.

Internal Assessment (20 Marks)

Internal Assessment of 20 marks in each term has the following components:

(a) Periodic Tests

There will be three tests in an academic year. The average of best 2 would be taken for first term and in second term the test out of twenty marks will be converted to 10 marks for final submission. All three tests are compulsory. If a child is absent for a test, the school has no provision for holding the tests at a later date.

(b) Multiple Assessment

Subject teacher will use techniques, such as observation, oral test, individual or group work, class discussion, field work, concept maps, exit cards, visual expression, graphic organizers etc. to assess the student.

(c) Portfolio

The assessment will include class work, peer assessment, self-assessment, reflections, narrations, journals and achievement of student in the subject.

Classes IX & X

Grading of Scholastic Subjects in Class X

In class X, both marks (80+20=100) and grades will be awarded on the basis of nine-point grading system in each scholastic subject. For awarding the grades, the board will put all the passed students (i.e. with score of 33% and above) in rank order and will award the grades as follows:

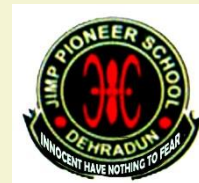

Criteria for Promotion

- Promotion is granted on the basis of cumulative performance of the pupil. Hence, it is important for a child to be regular in attendance, tests, term examination and assignments.
- For promotion, each student has to secure 33% marks out of overall 20 marks of internal assessment (periodic tests multiple assessment portfolio + subject enrichment activity) and 33% marks out of 80 marks in each subject of annual exam separately.
- The compartment policy shall be as specified by CBSE.
- Those who do not satisfy the condition for promotion / compartment, will be declared detained.
- The students indulging in unfair means during any examination will be awarded zero in that subject. **There will be no retest for such students.** Repetition of the same will result in expulsion. Neither they will be eligible for any academic award, school appointment nor any recognition by the school.
- **For further details, kindly refer to initial pages of Secondary School Curriculum 2026-27 for classes IX and X on www.cbse.gov.in.**
- As per present directions from CBSE, the Board has decided to introduce two levels of examination in Mathematics for the students who are going to appear in the board examination. But there shall be NO two levels of assessment / examination of Mathematics for class IX. For further details, kindly refer to CBSE Circular No. Acad-03/2019. In case some amendment / update from CBSE, the students will be provided the options as per guidelines in the subject.
- Class X syllabus will be completed by the end of September 2026 followed by set of revision tests. It is compulsory for all students to appear in revision tests.
- There will be two Pre-Final Examinations for class X.

From 2025-2026, CBSE had introduced two board examinations for class X, for further details kindly refer CBSE Circular No. CBSE/CE/ 2 - Board examination-X / 2025 dated 25/06/2025 .

Classes XI & XII

Scholastic Areas

In all scholastic subjects, the assessment scheme will have theory, internal assessment or practical components as per syllabus given for each subject. Subject wise distribution of these two components is:

- Duration of examination and weightage of examination in each subject will be as specified by CBSE.
- The students have to secure 33 percent in total in each of the components. They will have to pass in theory and practical separately.
- Marks and positional grades will be awarded on the basis of nine-point grading system in each scholastic subject. For awarding the grades, the board will put all the passed students (i.e. with score of 33% and above) in rank order and will award the grades same as for class X given on page No. 84.
- Internal Assessment or Practical Examination in the form of Practical / Project / ASL70/30/40/20/50 marks) in different subjects in each term will be as per details given in the syllabus for each subject.
- CLASS XI, syllabus in all subject will be divided into two terms. Syllabus of full academic session will be included in the Annual examination which will be strictly based on CBSE pattern.
- All tests are compulsory; school has no provision for holding the tests later for individual students. There will be two Pre Finals for class XII.

Grading for Class XI and XII

The report card will indicate positional letter grade in each subject on a nine-point scale as per CBSE pattern same as for class X.

Co-Scholastic Areas

Student will be assessed on nine-point scale in the following areas:

1. General Studies
 2. Health and Physical Education
 3. Work Experience
- The grading for Work Experience, Health and Physical Education, Environmental Education and General Studies shall be on the nine-point scale as per Board pattern.
 - General Studies will be assessed in the Term Examination. The weightage will be 50 marks

Classes XI & XII

Criteria for Promotion

1. Promotion is granted on the basis of cumulative performance of the pupil. Hence, it is important for a child to be regular in attendance, written tests, term-end examinations.
2. A clear pass will require minimum D2 grade in cumulative, in each subject as per promotion policy. Evaluation will be based on student's academic performance in the Half Yearly, Final exam and Written Tests in all terms.
3. For promotion, the students must pass in theory and practical separately in all subjects wherever it is applicable.
4. The compartment exams policy shall be as specified by CBSE.
5. Those who do not satisfy the conditions for promotion/ compartment will be declared detained.
6. Final decision regarding promotion will be made by a committee of senior faculty headed by the Principal.
7. The students who have not completed a regular course of study i.e. have not completed 75% attendance are not eligible to appear in the examination.
8. In class XII, in each term after the completion of syllabus, revision tests will be held. It is compulsory for all students to appear in revision tests.
9. There will be Pre- Finals for class XII in each term. The question papers and marking scheme of Pre Finals will be based on the pattern of CBSE Board Exams. The passing marks will be 33% to pass in theory and practical separately. The entire syllabus will be tested in the exams.
10. It is compulsory for all students to sit for all written tests as well as Pre-finals examinations

Important Guidelines by CBSE (Class IX to XII)

1. No student from a school affiliated to C.B.S.E. shall be eligible to take examination unless he/she has completed 75% attendance counted from opening of classes X and XII up to 31/12/2026. The students who have not completed a regular course of study i.e. have not completed 75% attendance are not eligible to appear in Board's examination of Class X/XII. Shortage of attendance up to 15% only, may be condoned by the Chairman, CBSE New Delhi only, on the recommendation of the Principal of the school. (Rule 13.2 of the CBSE Examination By laws and reiterated vide letter CE/F 22/2008/363-88 dated 22/09/08).
2. For sick leave, submission of a leave application together with a medical certificate duly signed by a doctor in government hospital is mandatory.
3. Candidates taking up the subject involving practical work shall also be required to have at least 75% of total attendance in the laboratory. Head of institutes shall not allow candidates to take the practical examination unless the candidate fulfills the attendance requirement. (Rule 13.1 of the CBSE Examination Bylaws)
4. Board awards Merit Certificate in each subject to the top 0.1% of candidates passing that subject.
5. As per the CBSE directives, an additional subject can be offered in Class X and XII only if it has been studied and passed in Class IX and XI respectively. Additional subject is not a substitute for a major subject.
